Term: Summer Term 2

Topic: Heroes and Heroines

Welcome back to the final half term. We hope you have had a restful break and ready for the final push. How quickly the year has flown!

English

In English, we will continue developing and applying our spelling, punctuation and grammar skills across all writing. We will be studying both fiction and non fiction text with a focus on creative writing, including poetry. As always, please continue to read with your child regularly and encourage them to complete journal work.



Mathematics: In Maths, we will continue to focus on telling the time, as well as data handling and position and direction.. Any additional practise with times tables, mental arithmetic and telling the time in minutes past and minutes to will greatly help your child, as telling time is always a tricky concept. By the end of Year 2, children need to know the 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables so that they can focus on the others when they move in to Year 3.

Science Topic:

Making connections- reduce, reuse and recycle

Our topic this term is focused around identifying materials and learning about reducing waste and reusing materials.

PE: Our PE days this half term are Monday and Wednesday when the children will be doing athletics and developing handball skills. Please could the children bring in a pair of trainers as most of the sessions will be outdoors, weather permitting? As usual, please check all PE kit and uniform is named and jewellery needs to be removed for all PE lessons.

Other subjects: In Computing, the pupils will continue to use Scratch to code and create quizzes.

- Use Google Classroom to submit completed home learning if preferred.
- Login to TTRockstars regularly to develop times table skills and fluency.
- Any opportunities to measure tell the time on an analogue clock will greatly help your child to tell the time and relate regular events to specific times during the day..
- Ensure your child reads regularly to an adult. By reading and discussing the text with your child, you are not just helping them to develop their fluency but also their understanding and inference skills.
- Practise reading and spelling 5 new words from the Year Two common exception word list each week. This is available on the school website.
- Talk to your children about how they can raise their independence and resilience.
